

Did you know that you have the right to refuse to dissect animals in Florida?

It's true! Each year, 10 million animals (including frogs, cats, and fetal pigs) are cruelly killed and then cut up in classrooms across the country—even though humane alternatives exist. Studies have shown that students who use alternatives to dissection perform just as well as—if not better than—students who cut up animals. You don't have to dissect animals! Explain to your teacher that you won't be dissecting and that the law [Fla. Stat: (Educ.) § 1002.20] gives you the right to say no to cutting up animals in Florida:

Parents may request that their child be excused from performing surgery or dissection in biological science classes [Fla. Stat: (Educ.) § 1002.20]

Dissection is unnecessary and cruel. Stand up for animals, and exercise your rights. Choose not to dissect.
