

Did you know that you have the right to refuse to dissect animals in Québec?

It's true! Each year, countless animals (including frogs, cats, and foetal pigs) are cruelly killed and then cut up in classrooms across the country—even though humane alternatives exist. Studies have shown that students who use alternatives to dissection perform just as well as—if not better than—students who cut animals up. You don't have to dissect animals. Explain to your teacher that you won't be dissecting and that the minister of education, recreation and sports confirmed your right to say no to cutting up animals in Québec:

[T]he science and technology programs aim to develop attitudes that are respectful to living beings and the environment among students and that do not require this kind of activity. Thus, using animal dissection is not required to meet the training needs. Also note that teachers have educational resources that offer animal dissection alternatives such as virtual simulations and other digital resources.

Dissection is unnecessary and cruel. Stand up for animals and exercise your rights. Choose not to dissect.
